Teacher-Teacher Collaboration

Unit Planning (big-time. We have created a UbD template for unit development)

Teacher-Student Collaboration - Middle School (Grades 6-8)

Peer Editing writing projects with both peers and teachers

Group research projects (Castles and Cathedrals grade 6, US History textbook chapter project grade 7, etc)

Lab data (for group analysis)

Teacher-Student Collaboration - Upper School (Grades 9-12)

Similar projects to above

Google Presentation for storyboarding a group Digital Story Telling Project

Class study guide - Teacher puts essential questions for unit and has students build the study guide for the unit, based upon readings and classroom discussion

Student-Student (Grades 6-12)
